INTRODUCTION:

Society for Children (SOCH) is a registered organization under Society Registration Act, 1860 at IGR, Cuttack, Odisha. The organization has been founded and started its work in 2012 in collaboration with SATHI, a national level NGO working in the field of child rescue and resettlement across India. At present SOCH works at Bhubaneswar Railway Station for rescue and resettlement of runaway children to the station.

VISION, MISSION AND OBJECTIVES:

The purpose of the society is charitable and nonprofit oriented. The activities of the society are aimed to realize rights of the vulnerable children in our society.

Vision: To create a just society, where all children are living happily, enjoying all their due rights.

Mission: To realize the rights of deprived children and their rehabilitation.

Aims and Objectives:

- To rescue and resettle runaway, missing, abducted and abandoned children. First priority will be given to family reunion and last option for Institutional care.
- To rescue and resettle working children.
- To rescue and resettle begging children.
- To rescue and rehabilitate addicted and hard behavior street children through de-addiction and behavioral modification camp.
- To run bridge camp for school dropout children for enrollment in formal education appropriate to the child's age.
- To provide health care service to children.
- To give safe and nurtured environment for orphan children.
- To give safe and nurtured environment for physically and mentally challenged children.
- To encourage foster parenting and alternative care for children in need of care and protection.
- To develop child centric community through awareness camp and necessary support.
- To do awareness campaign on child rights and other issue related to children.
- To conduct and participate in studies, surveys, seminars and work shop connected with children's issue.

OUTREACH, SENSITISATION AND NETWORK BUILDING AT RAILWAY STATIONS:

SOCH's main project for the rescue and resettlement of runaway children starts with outreach programs at the railway stations. Outreach workers of the projects patrol around the railway platforms to rescue newly landed runaway/abandoned children. Depending on the number of staff available, SOCH team tries to cover the railway station for maximum period of time in the day.



Network building and sensitization play an important role and SOCH outreach staff always tries to sensitize the issue of child trafficking among all the stakeholders present at the railway stations. Stakeholders includes vendors, collies, govt. railway police, railway protection force, ticket collectors, station cleaning staffs, parcel staffs, etc..

In the period Aug, 2012 to July, 2013, SOCH worked only at the Bhubaneswar railway station and we were able to rescue 347 children out of which 28 children have been referred by various aforementioned stake holders.

NETWORK BUILDING:

In order to be able to trace the children at stations SOCH has established good ties with various stakeholders at railway stations. This makes it easier for SOCH to be able to identify the children at stations and rescue them. These include vendors, coolies, parcel workers, auto drivers and GRP. The SOCH team regularly holds meetings with them to strengthen their ties.

There are 30 vendor stalls at Bhubaneswar station. The SOCH team regularly meets up with these vendors taking into consideration that the vendors are not permanently based at the stalls. With this they make sure that every new vendor is a part of their network.

The Coolie team at Bhubaneswar station includes 90 members. These work in two groups. Meetings with coolies help in sensitizing them regarding the work done by SOCH and making them aware of the issues and needs of children landing on railway platforms.

Meeting with the parcel workers who are involved in luggage loading in the trains, was to raise the standard of referral cases and to sensitize them regarding the work done by SOCH.

Several auto drivers reside and operate near Bhubaneswar railway station. Regular meetings are held with them and the secretary of their association in order to gain their support for the rescue of the children.

Below a few brief reports of network building

1. RPF introduction Meeting:

We conducted an introduction meeting with RPF (Railway protection force) staff with the aim of creating good rapport with them and sensitizing them regarding our work so that they can contribute to the initiative in their capacity.



The meeting was held at RPF post at Bhubaneswar on 13th March, 2013. 20 RPF staff including 2 Sub Inspectors was present there. We provided them our contact numbers and brief information about street and runaway children. We have been getting positive response from them.

2. Introduction meeting with TTE:

SOCH team had also conducted an introduction meeting with TTEs on 12th March, 2013 at CTI office. There were 3 TTE and 2 Head TTE and we gave them our contact numbers and sensitized them about how they can help the children as well as SOCH.

3. DD entry in GRPS at Bhubaneswar railway station:

We started daily diary entry in GRPS at Bhubaneswar Railway station and after that meeting we got a lot of positive response from them. A girl was referred by GRP March, 2013 and we did her home placement in their presence.

4. Meeting with NUTECH Group (station cleaning group):

The main motto behind this meeting was to make the station cleaning group aware of the initiative taken up by SOCH, so that they could contribute to the aim of rescuing the run-away children.

So far, one girl child has been referred by them and they have also helped the team several times in various ways.

5. Meetings with Coolies:

A number of meetings with coolies have been organized at the Bhubaneswar railway station.

After the meetings, many coolies are helping the SOCH team at the station in rescuing children.



6. Meeting with Vendors:

Regular meetings were conducted with the vendors of Bhubaneswar railway station. SOCH team has been meeting them and sensitizing them about the work of SOCH. Around 30 stall vendors are involved in this initiative. After our meetings, we have been got much positive response from them.



7. Organized meeting with parcel-men:

A meeting with parcel workers (those working at the railway station for luggage loading in trains) was organized on 1st June 2013. It was organized in a temple near the Railway station. 70 parcel men attended this meeting. The main objective was to raise referral cases and also to sensitize them regarding our work.



8. Meeting with old children at the station

We organized a meeting with old children on 30th March, 2013 in the premises of Bhubaneswar railway station on platform no-4. They have been living at the station for a long period of time. Most of them left home for some reasons and have now accepted platform life. They have got engaged in different kinds of activities like cleaning platform and train bogies, rag picking, pick-pocketing, etc.



9. Organized a meeting with Auto drivers:

The main objective of this project is to rescue and rehabilitate the needy children from Railway station as well as the street. We successfully organized the auto drivers' meeting on 20th June 2013 at Bhubaneswar railway station. 10 auto drivers along with the secretary of the auto drivers' union were present.



10. Did a home placement in front of Parcel members' secretary and IIC of GRP:



Involved Mr.Saubhagya kumar Swain (IIC of GRP) and Secretary of Parcel members and one of their staff during the time of home placement.

11. Visit of students from Palli Unnayan Seva Samiti (PUSS):

PUSS is a society providing residential school facility to girl children from disadvantaged socio-economic backgrounds. On 7th January, 2013, the students of PUSS visited SOCH to know about the activities carried out by the organization.



12. Children's Day Celebration:

On the occasion of Children's Day (14th November, 2012), SOCH organised a special program with the motive of sharing some memorable, happy moments with the old children. This was held on platform number one at Bhubaneswar railway station. Most of these children have been found to be living at the station for quite some time. They have various reasons for leaving their homes and have got themselves adapted to life on a railway platform. They are engaged in activities like cleaning of the platform and train bogies, rag picking, pick pocketing, etc. on a daily basis.



13. Thanksgiving ceremony:

After the home placement of above one hundred children, 'SOCH THANKS GIVING CEREMONY' was organized on the 28th of February 2013 at Divine life society, Ashok Nagar, (Near Arya Sanskruti Mandira) Bhubaneswar.

The main motto behind it was to acknowledge our appreciation of all the supporters- those who helped the staff in the process of rescuing the children and in the motivating process. The parents of resettled children were also present in that meeting and shared their feelings with the audience. The program will hopefully help us to involve our supporters in our work in the future also.



BASE LINE SURVEY AT KHURDA RAILWAY STATION

Duration of the survey: - 3 days (8th July to 10th July, 2013)

Timing of the survey :- (9am to 6pm) daily

Objective of the survey:

- To know about the inflow of fresh and newly landed children at Khurda Railway station.
- To understand the main issues of runaway children at Khurda station.
- To identify the status of old children.
- To create good rapport with railway authorities and stake holders.

About Khurda Railway Station:

Khurda junction is situated near Jatani square. There are seven platforms out of which trains mostly ply from the second, third, fourth and fifth platforms. There is a small slum colony near the station and as the station is very large many children from this slum come to the station for food and rest.



Major findings:

- During the time of our three day survey, we contacted 26 children out of which we rescued 16. Of the 16 rescued children, most belonged to the age group of 11-14 years.
- Most of the children were from Odisha state and a few belonged to Bihar.
- During the survey, we contacted only boys. Out of the seven platforms, majority of the children were rescued from platform nos. 4 & 5.
- As per our survey, the inflow of runaway children to the Khurda railway station per day is approximately five.

COUNSELLING

Child Counseling: In order to deal with the vulnerable emotional and psychological state of mind of the rescued children, counseling facility is in place.

With their vivid imaginations, wandering curiosities, and playful attitudes, children need special care and nourishment for a healthy future. The small children who run away from their houses for a better future, adventure or family problems often face the brutality of fate and succumb to insurmountable pressure that



street life renders upon them. With a view of this deadly consequence we do all in our capacity to unite such children with their family. SOCH staff, after rescuing the child from the station tries to counsel him so that his problem and also his run-away motive would become clear.

The counseling provided to children plays a significant role in finding out about the parents of the rescued children and on taking further steps in their reunion/rehabilitation as applies. The success rate of the cases depends on the extent to which the children are influenced by counseling. After proper counseling of the children it becomes easy for us to find out their problems and work effectively towards their welfare.

A fruitful counselling session reveals the real reason for having run-away from home and also the residential address comes out. This helps us to reunite the child with his parents. As this process requires expertise, SOCH team recently incorporated a counsellor into the team to deal with these affairs. The whole process is carried on with extreme care and dedication so that the child meets his parents as early as possible.

Parents Counseling: Counselling is also provided to parents who come to take their children back to their homes. Counselling thus



acts as a bridge between the child and his parents to attempt reconciliation and deal with the misunderstandings or miscommunication that could be responsible for the child running away.

In other words, counseling parents ensures that they understand the problem of their children and the incidence of child leaving home is not repeated. This ensures that parents are clear what was troubling the child at home and what exactly made him leave home. Several people have appreciated this approach of SOCH.

This whole process of counselling is done with the help of a professional counselor who first counsels the child in order to know his problem and later makes aware the parents of the same. Also the child is made to understand his mistake and both child and parents are educated how to come up with strategies for solutions to various developmental problems that the child and the parents may face.

A few Positive experiences:

1. **Suraj Pachim Kabat**, a 14 years old boy belonging to a well-to-do family was found at platform no-1 by SOCH staff on 4th December 2012 at 4pm. After interacting with the SOCH staff he revealed that he is from Khurda road (Jatani) and he came to Bhubaneswar for an outing. At shelter after the counseling he stated information about his family, but he did not remember any contact number of his family members. However we were fortunate to trace his address and after interacting with his parents we came to know that he hails from a well-to-do family. Suraj has a problem that he does not like to study. Whenever he is pressurized to study he leaves home

and runs away, He doesn't have much interest to study. Then Suraj was counseled individually about the importance of studies and the difficulties he could face if he runs away. We did his telephonic follow up on the date of 14th January 2013 and got to know that Suraj is continuing his study and living with his family.

2. Sanjit Pal aged 14 years was brought to shelter from Bhubaneswar railway station on 24th Jan 2013. Despite repeated efforts, the child was not willing to share any information. Accidentally he walked away from the shelter at 12 pm. Again the staff found him on 25th Jan 2013 at the same railway station. Again this time even during counseling he did not tell anything. It took some time for him to open up with the counsellor and he gradually shared everything about his family as well as his run away incident. Sanjit is the son of Mr. Dillip Pal, who lives in Randia village under Bhadrak police station of Bhadrak District. His father has a small business of vegetables. Reportedly, his father always restricts him from doing what he likes and often reprimands him for spending time with friends. So the child became fed up with the life he was leading and left home. He decided to go to Chennai where his elder brother is working. While he was with us, his family were also searching for him and spent more than Rs 2000. Then by the help of RPF his parents got the child from SOCH on 24th Jan 2013. On 23rd February we did the telephonic follow-up and came to know that now he is continuing his study and regularly attending his school.

3. Rahul, a 14 years old boy studying in 5th standard ran away from his home in the Mahuda village of Dhanbad dist of Jharkhand. He was rescued by SOCH staff at Bhubaneswar Railway station on the platform no 1 on 13th Feb. 2013 around 5.30pm. The child was not in a proper dress, but he had Rs 100 and also a mobile phone in his pocket. The child gradually shared the reason behind his running away from home. One day he was not interested to go to school for which his mother had scolded and beaten him. Reportedly she also restricted him from playing with his friends and forced him to study, all of due to which he decided to run away from home. On his way, he stole Rs 500 and his uncle's mobile phone which was switched off very soon. At the shelter the staff charged his mobile, and had one incoming call in some time. The staff picked this call and told everything about Rahul and our work. After staying one day at shelter his uncle came to get him. His uncle was very happy to see his nephew. They lodged an FIR at local police station also. After that we advised his uncle to take care of him and allow him some time for playing. Then on 15th Feb. at sharp 10 am the staff handed over the child to his

uncle. On 12th March we did the follow up and found that his parents are happy with the behavior of Rahul and they thanked SOCH staff for their noble job.

A few Negative experiences:

1. **Chandan Das**, a 14 years old boy was found on the platform no 1 at Bhubaneswar railway station on 24 Dec 2012 in the evening at 6.30 pm. He was working at the railway track when our volunteers tracked him. He was very happy when he reached the shelter.

Chandan is the son of Mr.Kartik Das who lives in Rathagada village under Dhenkanal police station of Dhenkanal district. By analyzing him it seemed that he belonged to a middle class family. At shelter, Chandan told that he had left his home 2yeras ago. He used to study at Puri in Betric School and was not academically sound. One day when he secured quite less marks in exam, his brother hit him and scolded him badly. This prompted him to run away from his home. After leaving home he started picking bottles in the railway tracks and selling those in Cuttack.

However, with more prodding, the staff felt that he was lying and there could be some other reason for his running away from home. So the staff carefully explained to Chandan that only if he gave the right information, they will be able to help him. Chandan told our staff that before some days he was working in press but because of getting less money for his work he left his house and started working on the railway station.

On asking whether he could recall any phone number, he replied in the negative. So we approached other sources to get the required information. On receiving his parents' contact information, our staff did his Home placement by going to his residence by themselves. His parents were elated to see their son back home. But he was on a different path already and again ran away from his home on 13 February 2013.

2. **Srinu Reddy**, a 13 years old boy was contacted by the SOCH staff on the platform no-1 at Bhubaneswar Railway station. Srinu Reddy is the son of Mr. Umapati Reddy who lives in Gobinpur. He migrated to Bhubaneswar 10 years ago. His father is a gardner and his mother is wage labour. They stay in Mahavir Nagar, Saliasahi, Bhubaneswar.

Srinu belongs to a poor family. His father is alcoholic and spends most of his earnings on alcohol. Out of his habit of alcohol he used to engage in brawls with friends and family. Under the influence of alcohol, his father beat him once badly and he in response ran away from home.

On inquiring at shelter he started to cry. The staff promised to help him and patiently interrogated him. Then the child gave his neighbour's contact number. As per the phone number the staff contacted his neighbour. But before his parents could come to shelter to take him back, he ran away.

ADDRESS TRACING

After rescuing the child from various places, he is brought to SOCH shelter and is provided food and shelter till he is handed over to his parents. After giving the child some time to socialize he is counseled by the experienced counselor of SOCH and with that help the child's address is located. Sometimes however the child remains silent intentionally as he takes the SOCH staff as his enemies as they tried to curb his plan of running away from his home and this becomes a trouble as SOCH, due to its limited accommodation facility, they aren't able to take care after some days and so the children sometimes are handed over to the nearby NGO who takes over. So in case where the child is unable to answer about his residence, SOCH team allows him to socialize by giving him some time on his own to communicate with other boys in the shelter. Consequently the child realises that the SOCH team is actually trying to help him and thus starts to interact with SOCH team. Sometimes however when the child still doesn't break, the SOCH team takes the help of the counsellor who also tries hard to befriend the child. In the process food and other supports are given to the child. Sometimes however after all the efforts goes in vain to try to find out his address, the SOCH team simply take the help of police to notify for any missing diaries. Also the SOCH staffs use the help of internet to solve the problems. Sometimes the subject can only remember the village where he hails from and with that little help, his residence is located and his parents are contacted.

SHELTER ACTIVITIES

Presently SOCH owns a temporary shelter home near Bhubaneswar Railway Station where the rescued children stay till they are handed over to their respective families or produced before Child Welfare Committee within 24 hours. Railway stations being an unsafe place, the children are brought to this shelter home by the SOCH staff members. The rescue operation is followed by counseling sessions till the child is safely handed over to his/her parents. Till then children are provided with clothes, food, first-aid services, non-formal education etc.

Provisions for clothing:

Goonj, an organization, which renders the service all over India has been providing support as far as clothing is concerned. Most often children who are rescued are encountered in sullied physical condition; hence this requirement.

Provisions for food:

Majority of the times children at the Bhubaneswar Railway station are rescued who have been staying there for long periods without any financial help. Hunger becomes a major issue for them and so we, till their rehabilitation, provide them food at the shelter.

First-aid services:

Children, if found in injured condition, are provided with basic facilities of first-aid.



Non-educational and recreational activities:

At shelter we also provide them with some non-formal education like drawing, storytelling and sometimes we also engage them in drawing competitions. These types of teaching material support are provided by Goonj.

Birthday celebrations:

The organisation has been following a pattern of regularly holding a celebration to bring the joy of birthday parties to the kids of their shelter home. This way it is easier to connect with them and the kids feel at home. The celebration of the most important day in their life makes them feel special and allows them to receive the attention that they otherwise wouldn't receive.

Holi celebration:

SOCH takes initiatives to celebrate major festivals with the children. On Holi, the staff narrated the mythology connected with the festival for their cultural enrichment.

HOME PLACEMENT

With a believe family is best place for child's overall growth, SOCH tries to reunited children with their caring families on 1st priority. Only when family not able to trace or child don't want to be with family (after counseling), SOCH refer the child to other NGOs for institutional care.

At SOCH children are kept for maximum of 1 day in the shelter; in the mean time we consult the children for knowing his whereabouts. Then on the basis of the consultation if possible the family is contacted and children is reunited with the family or sent to other NGOs if family can't be tracked. We report to CWC for subsequent decision regarding keeping the child in shelter within 24 hours. If necessary we keep the children in the shelter for a maximum of 1 week for consultation purpose.

On tracking a child we immediately try to contact their parents with the help of phone no. shared by child, through police, our staff physically, through other NGO's or with the help of other stakeholders involved in the project such as coolies on the railway platform and vendors present at railway station.

In most of the cases, family comes to SOCH after contact to receive their runaway children and family reunion takes place at SOCH shelter.

Positive Experiences:

The stakeholders in the premises of the railway station have been very co-operative. They play a big role in the process of rescuing the children and referring the runaway kids to the SOCH team.

Negative Experiences:

Many a times the organisation comes across family members who are alcoholic which affects the counseling process.

There have been instances when the child has escaped from the shelter. On one occasion, this happened when the parents of the child were about to come to the organisation to take him back. This led to issues in handling the parents.

Challenges**Language Problems:**

The children coming to Bhubaneswar are often from the adjoining states and can converse in their native language only. The SOCH team often finds it difficult to handle such cases.

There has been a case of Budhiram Singh, a 12 year old boy who was rescued from platform number one at Bhubaneswar railway station. He was from Mayurbhanj district but could speak in his native language only which made it difficult for the staff to trace his address. The staff had to finally take help from Sadar Baripada police station.

Begging Children:

The organisation finds it difficult to rescue children who are dependent on begging for earning money. Many girls are found to be involved in this activity.

Rescuing girls:

The organisation finds it very difficult to rescue girls in comparison to boys. Out of the 6 girl children rescued only 2 have been sent back to their homes. Two of them have been sent to an NGO and the other two have been referred to Child Welfare Committee.

One girl child (14years old) rescued from Bhubaneswar railway station was working initially as a maid servant in a house where she was not treated well. She wanted to return home but did not have sufficient money for the same. She was referred to SOCH by a GRP official. SOCH managed to trace her address and send her back.

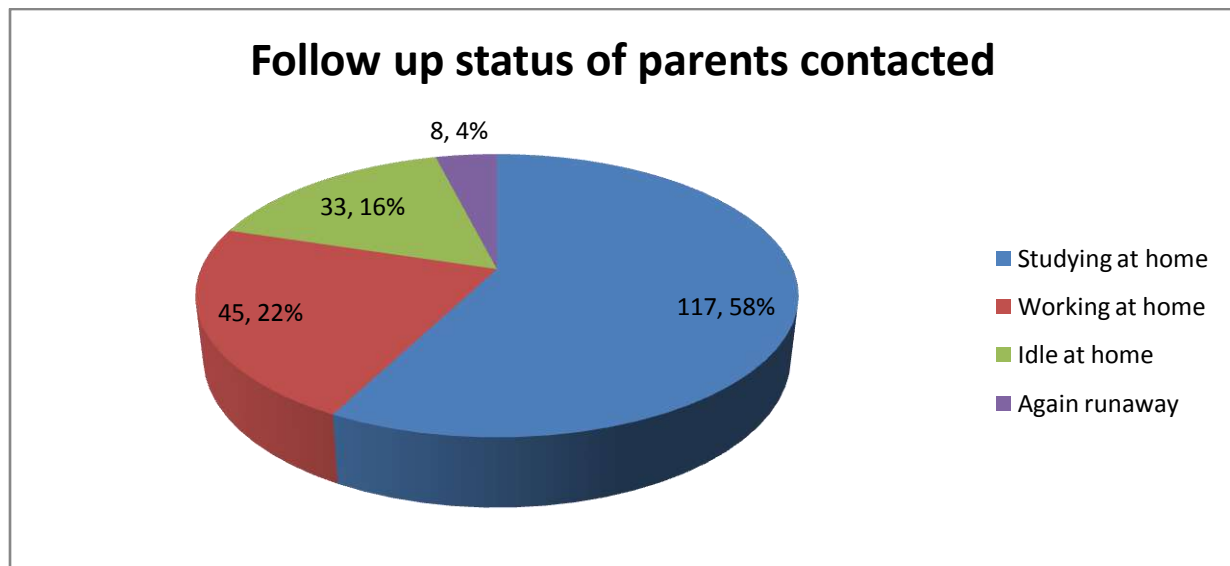
TELEPHONIC FOLLOW UP

SOCH is concerned about the well-being of the child even after handling him/her to their parents. This is the reason for conducting a telephonic follow up, so that we could know about the child's status after restoring him to his home. Many people have appreciated this approach of SOCH and consider the organization as a very serious, promising, responsible and caring.

The time period of contacting the parents initially to know about the child is around after a month of the reunion of the child with his family. Another follow up is done after 3 months. The only case that we are not successful in this respect is when the contact number provided is changed or is inoperative. The organization has a whole hearted aim of the child safety at all times.
